



Emergency Housing Voucher FAQs

- How do I know if I'm eligible for an Emergency Housing Voucher?
 - To qualify for an Emergency Housing Voucher, you must currently be in one of the following four eligibility categories:
 1. Homeless
 2. At risk of homelessness
 3. Fleeing, or attempting to flee, domestic violence, dating violence, sexual assault, stalking, or human trafficking
 4. Recently homeless or have a high risk of housing instability
 - Individuals and families who fall within one of the four eligibility categories listed above, will be prioritized:
 1. Individuals 18-24 years old
 2. Rapid Rehousing households whose subsidy ends before August 2022
 3. Households that are victims of domestic violence
 4. Families with children **as defined by HUD**
 5. Individuals experiencing homelessness in shelter and street settings (adults only)
 - To determine eligibility for any MOHS housing opportunities or services (including Emergency Housing Vouchers), you must complete Coordinated Access with one of the agencies listed on [Emergency Housing Voucher Program | Mayor's Office of Homeless Services \(baltimorecity.gov\)](#).
- I meet the criteria for eligibility, how do I get an Emergency Housing Voucher?
 - Please complete Coordinated Access with one of the agencies listed on [Emergency Housing Voucher Program | Mayor's Office of Homeless Services \(baltimorecity.gov\)](#) to confirm eligibility and be referred to the Housing Authority of Baltimore City.
- Who can I contact about receiving an Emergency Housing Voucher?
 - Please review the eligibility criteria listed above. If you qualify, contact one of the agencies listed on [Emergency Housing Voucher Program | Mayor's Office of Homeless Services \(baltimorecity.gov\)](#) to complete Coordinated Access.
- Who manages Emergency Housing Vouchers?
 - The Housing Authority of Baltimore City administers the Emergency Housing Vouchers.
- I am currently on a housing voucher wait list, will I be considered for an Emergency Housing Voucher?
 - The only way to be considered for an Emergency Housing Voucher is to complete Coordinated Access with one of the agencies listed on [Emergency Housing Voucher Program | Mayor's Office of Homeless Services \(baltimorecity.gov\)](#).
- What is the process to receive an Emergency Housing Voucher?
 - If you have completed Coordinated Access and been deemed eligible to receive an Emergency Housing Voucher, a case manager or housing navigator will notify you that you have been referred to the Housing Authority of Baltimore City to complete the housing process.
- How do I check the status of my Coordinated Access packet?
 - To check your Coordinated Access status, please call the agency with which you completed the Coordinated Access process.
- What is the eligibility deadline to receive an Emergency Housing Voucher?
 - The goal is to have all 278 vouchers issued by December 31, 2021.
